WHO WE ARE

Tri-City Medical Center has served our community for over 50 years and is one of the largest employers in North San Diego County. As a 397 bed, full-service acute care hospital with three primary care clinics and over 700 physicians practicing in over 60 specialties, Tri-City is vital to the well-being of our community and serves as a healthcare safety net for many of our citizens. Tri-City's importance to our community is exemplified by the current success we have achieved by being one of only three hospitals in San Diego County to achieve six consecutive "A" Leapfrog ratings in patient safety along with several national accreditations and excellent clinical outcomes. Our Gold Seal of Approval® from the Joint Commission displays our commitment to safe and effective patient care for the residents of the community we serve.

Having the second busiest emergency room in San Diego County reinforces the need for Tri-City Medical Center in our District. We also operate the only Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) in North County, as well as an Orthopaedic & Spine Institute, Cardiovascular Health Institute, Neuroscience Institute, and the Tri-City Wellness Center in Carlsbad, recognized as one of the best wellness centers in San Diego County. We pride ourselves in specializing in women's health, robotic surgery, cancer and emergency care.

Tri-City Medical Center has continuously operated with the goals of providing the most advanced medical service, the best medical education, and the most caring emotional support to the communities it serves.

A MESSAGE FROM CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER STEVE DIETLIN



Tri-City Healthcare District's mission is to advance the health and wellness of the community we serve. Tri-City is in fact owned and governed by the community it serves and I'm fortunate to have the opportunity to collaborate with many community partners including the medical staff, nurses, auxiliary, foundation, employees and Board of Directors to deliver this mission. The commitment of so many community stakeholders to provide excellent clinical outcomes is impressive. The needs of Tri-City's patients come first as is demonstrated by the sixth consecutive Leapfrog Hospital Safety Score of Grade A. The Leapfrog Group is nationally recognized for objectively measuring safety based on clinical outcomes data. Grade A is the highest safety rating possible and Tri-City is one of only

three hospitals in San Diego to receive an A rating. Six consecutive A's does not happen by accident. It takes the commitment and collaboration of many working together toward a common community goal.

Tri-City treated over sixty-five thousand patients in the Emergency Department last year and has one of the busiest Emergency Departments in San Diego County. In order to improve care delivery, decrease wait times and provide an improved patient experience, Tri-City expanded the emergency triage area, purchased and installed the most advanced 512 CT Scanner available and opened a Crisis Stabilization Unit. The GE Healthcare Revolution™ CT Scanner is faster, with improved resolution and lower radiation exposure. The Crisis Stabilization Unit was opened in order to better serve patient mental health needs in the most appropriate setting. This provides for an improved patient experience for patients with mental illness and Emergency Department patients.

The affiliation agreement with UC San Diego Health Care Network aligns with Tri-City's mission to advance the health and wellness of the community we serve, as well as Tri-City's vision to be recognized as the healthcare system of choice in our community. Collaborating with San Diego's world-class academic health system leverages the combined strengths of Tri-City and UC San Diego Health to provide expanded access to locally-provided healthcare services. Solidifying the affiliation agreement required the collaboration of many, particularly the medical staff of both entities. UC San Diego Health faculty have performed cardiothoracic surgeries and neurosurgeries at Tri-City and the two entities have joined together to perform Intraoperative Radiation Therapy (IORT) at Tri-City. IORT is an early stage breast cancer treatment that introduces a single dose of radiation therapy immediately following a lumpectomy with a goal of avoiding extended periods of radiation. We remain excited and energized by this opportunity to build on and enhance patient care services offered to the community we serve.

As we look to the future, campus development comes into focus. While the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit and labor and delivery departments are being remodeled and steps have been taken to improve care delivery and decrease wait times, a long-term campus development plan is necessary to address seismic compliance, additional parking, ED expansion and additional community needs. In order to properly address these issues a campus development concept has been prepared and Tri-City has entered into a Joint Powers Agreement with the City of Oceanside to allow Tri-City to exercise the city's statutory design-build authority. The design-build approach combines both architect and contractor into a single point of responsibility in order to improve project quality, minimize time delays and reduce costs.

Access to long-term capital to support hospital operations and campus development is critical in order to deliver our mission to the community we serve. Instead of asking the public for bond funding Tri-City is pursuing longterm financing, and following a successful meeting in Washington, D.C. with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), Tri-City has been invited to submit an application for mortgage insurance. A successful HUD financing, or an alternate long-term financing opportunity, would allow Tri-City to refinance current debt in order to release capital for operations and campus development.

These are exciting times at Tri-City made possible through the collaboration of many committed community partners and governed by the community Board of Directors that you, the Community, chose to govern Tri-City. Let's look forward to continued delivery of the highest quality healthcare and a positive future together at our community hospital, Tri-City Medical Center.

A WORD FROM OUR CHIEF OF STAFF

When people ask me about how things are going at Tri-City, I can't help but share how optimistic about the future I am these days. While the campus may lack shiny new marble floors, the unwavering investments in patient safety resulted in Tri-City receiving its 6th consecutive Hospital Safety Score of Grade A this last spring (www.hospitalsafetyscore.org). With so many confusing measures of achievement and performance cluttering the healthcare landscape, the non-profit Leapfrog Group is committed to promoting transparency in the U.S. healthcare system and has become the gold standard in objectively measuring safety and quality. In fact, the Johns Hopkins Armstrong Institute for Patient Safety and Quality assessed the data independently and concluded that a patient who chooses care at a C grade hospital has a 35% higher risk of avoidable death compared to a patient who chooses their care at an A grade hospital like Tri-City.

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With a district board comprised of exceptional leaders, each bringing a wealth of experience with a diversified skill-set, they have charted a new course for Tri-City, not just for today, but for the next decade and beyond. Chosen to captain Tri-City in these exciting times, CEO Steven Dietlin is a proven leader who advocates for creating a patient centric organization, and brings years of experience in healthcare finance. He is, once and for all, the leader with a progressive vision that Tri-City has long deserved.

But what lies ahead shouldn't overshadow what's happening now.

- A newly installed GE Revolution[™] CT scanner, the first of its kind in southern California, offering a glimpse into the future of imaging with higher image resolution at a fraction of the radiation exposure.
- A spine institute now recognized as a national **leader in minimally invasive robotic spine surgeries** with one of the most robust programs in California.


- Work has begun on **remodeling the labor and delivery suites**, coupled with the soon to begin build-out of all **new private Neonatal Intensive Care Unit suites**.
- This September, Tri-City opened a **Crisis Stabilization Unit**, one of only two in San Diego County, to better serve the needs of our behavioral health clients, while alleviating the impact on the emergency room.
- Recently completed in the emergency room lobby is the new **Team Triage bay** that allows for simultaneous evaluation by our nursing team and clinicians, providing care for those with urgent but not emergent needs at the point of contact, thereby reserving emergency room beds for the most seriously ill. This should have a dramatic impact on waiting room times.
- The soon to be developed **Institute for Clinical Effectiveness**, a joint venture with leading healthcare technology platforms, where Tri-City physicians will not only aggregate data but utilize that data to generate predictive analytic algorithms with real world applicability. This will pave the way to better outcomes and quality for the future.
- Of course, one of the most exciting developments is the newly formed **affiliation between Tri-City Medical Center and UC San Diego Health Care Network**. The future of healthcare lies in finding synergies between organizations that are mutually beneficial, not only driving down the cost of care but improving the overall quality of care. Leveraging the pioneering research capabilities and subspecialty care that UCSD possesses benefits Tri-City district residents by enhancing the comprehensive network of care that can be delivered locally. For once, we can have our cake and eat it, too! Primary and secondary care in the hands of trusted community doctors who not only have cared for us in North County for generations but excel at delivering that care, yet at the same time, world-class tertiary/quarternary care delivered in our own backyard guided by physicians who have a vested interest in our health and well-being. The specifics are rapidly evolving and soon to be finalized. Stay tuned!

The nurses and ancillary staff continue to amaze me on a daily basis, going out of their way to show the true heart of Tri-City. Many of you who have experienced the care here at Tri-City can attest to that. Delivering great quality lives at the heart of every patient interaction we as a medical staff are fortunate enough to be a part of, and being awarded the highest standard of quality in North County was never our destination. Tri-City Medical Center earned its **6th consecutive 'A' rating** for exceptional patient safety from the nationally-recognized Hospital Safety Score Leapfrog Group.

Tri-City Medical Center is 1 of only 3 hospitals in San Diego County to receive 6 consecutive "A" ratings!

The Hospital Safety Score is the gold standard rating for patient safety, compiled under the guidance of the nation's leading patient safety experts and administered by The Leapfrog Group, a national, independent nonprofit organization.

Tri-City Medical Center was again awarded the **Mission: Lifeline® Gold-Plus award**, **Mission: Lifeline® Gold Receiving**, and the **Get With the Guidelines Gold-Plus Award** from the American Heart Association for providing life-saving heart attack & stroke treatment.

The Mission: Lifeline® Gold-Plus award is in recognition of Tri-City Medical Center achieving a score greater than 75 percent on all Mission: Lifeline Receiving Center Quality Measures as well as achieving at least a 75 percent achievement on First Door to Device time under 120 minutes for STEMI transfer patients from other facilities.

Fully Accredited by Joint Commission

The Joint Commission, the national organization that establishes standards for healthcare quality and safety, has again awarded Tri-City Medical Center its Gold Seal of Approval® and accreditation. The accreditation recognizes healthcare efforts in areas such as patient rights, medication management, and infection control.

Tri-City Medical Center is a leader in robotic surgery, specifically the Mazor Robotics Renaissance for spine surgery. The 1000th surgical case in California was conducted at Tri-City and the hospital is in fact a training location for many surgeons in the region!
Dr. Payam Moazzaz has performed over 400 surgeries utilizing Mazor technology, making him the most experienced Mazor surgeon in the nation!

Each year the TCHD Board of Directors allocates funds for healthcare projects of non-profit agencies located in and serving residents of North County. These funds are allocated through a grant process, coordinated by the Community Healthcare Alliance Committee (CHAC). The CHAC is comprised of members of the community from agencies like local chambers, the fire department, school districts, and many more. This commitee meets monthly to contibute to the ongoing discussion about what the needs of our community are and how Tri-City can best serve our area. This year \$300,000 was distributed, 100% of which was reinvested back into our healthcare district.

Sept. 10, hundreds of thriving families, ranging from newborns to grandparents, came to Tri-City Medical Center to celebrate the 30th anniversary of the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. The unit has been caring for the community's tiniest and most vulnerable patients since 1986 and is currently the only level III NICU in North County.

Families enjoyed reuniting with the doctors and nurses, showing off their growing children and teens and partaking in a hearty BBQ accompanied by shaved ice and cupcakes. They were joined by roaming Star Wars characters, a check in from the tooth fairy and the medical center's therapy dogs. An enthusiastic troupe of MiraCosta College volunteers assisted with games in a tented activity zone and the background music almost drowned out the exuberant hammering of kids attacking their DIY projects, coordinated by Home Depot volunteers. The medical center's various departments were also on-hand to share details about the wealth of resources and support services offered by the community hospital.

Lifelong bonds have formed between the specialists, caregivers, parents and families who have been a part of the intense love and dedication that comes with caring for a delicate NICU baby. Tri-City Medical Center celebrates these important relationships every 5 years during this reunion. This year there were over 1000 attendees. 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FAST FACTS: NEONATAL INTENSIVE CARE UNIT

- The NICU sees close to 600 babies each year, and its team works day and night to ensure each family feels close to their little ones
- Tri-City Medical Center's 29-bed NICU nursery is the largest in North County
- The NICU opened in 1986, and today is the only Level III NICU in North County, providing the highest level of neonatal care and most advanced technology available in the region
- Tri-City's NICU has board certified neonatologists on-site 24 hours a day, 7 days a week this team includes:
 - o Dr. Hamid Movahhedian (Dr. Mo), MD, FAAP, Chief of Division of Neonatology, NICU Medical Director
 - o Dr. Pedro Paz, MD, MPH, FAAP, Associate NICU Medical Director, Staff Neonatologist
 - o Dr. Ramana Uher, MD, FAAP, Staff Neonatologist

FAAP = Fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics. Pediatricians who maintain their FAAP designation have obtained board certification in pediatrics and made an ongoing commitment to lifelong learning and advocacy for children.

• Other in-house staff include neonatal nurse practitioners, registered nurses trained in neonatal care, occupational and physical therapists, certified lactation consultants for breastfeeding support, neonatal nutritional specialists, neonatal respiratory care practitioners and social workers



Tri-City Medical Center is the first hospital in San Diego County to employ NicView webcams in the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) - The system was implemented in December 2012 and includes a password protected portal that enables parents to view their infants in the NICU from anywhere in the world from any web-enabled device at any time.

o In its first year alone, Tri-City's NicView system served families on every continent in the world and allowed for close to 39,000 camera views o Each day, nurses write notes to babies' families with updates on how they're doing and what progress they've made, which are displayed via the NicView camera system.

o Staffers report 99 percent of NICU families use the service

CRISIS STABILIZATION UNIT

After many months of planning, Tri-City Medical Center has opened a Crisis Stabilization Unit (CSU) to provide 24-hour psychiatric medical care to adult patients experiencing a serious mental health crisis.

The psychiatric care is provided in the hospital on an outpatient basis for patients 18 and older seeking psychiatric care voluntarily or placed under an involuntary hold in keeping with state law. All CSU patients are medically screened first in the medical center's Emergency Department before being triaged and admitted to the CSU for stabilization. Where necessary, the CSU will also facilitate inpatient hospitalization. The CSU is staffed by an interdisciplinary team consisting of psychiatrists, psychologists, psychiatric mental health nurse practitioners, registered nurses, licensed marriage and family therapists (MFT), licensed social workers, and supervised MFT and post-graduate interns and trainees, and peer support and family support specialists.

"We formed the Crisis Stabilization Unit to better serve members of our community who are in need of mental health services," said Steve Dietlin, CEO, Tri-City Medical Center. "It ensures they get the specialized care they need quickly as well as coping strategies, medication intervention, and supportive referrals after they are discharged."

The new Crisis Stabilization Unit accepts walk-ins from the Tri-City Medical Center emergency room, outpatient referrals from the hospital's partners in the North County community and patients dropped off by county law enforcement including the county's Psychiatric Emergency Response Team (PERT) and local police.

According to the American College of Emergency Physicians, psychiatric emergencies are a national healthcare crisis. Crisis stabilization programs like the one developed by Tri-City Medical Center in conjunction with the County of San Diego, seek to provide solutions that work for patients and providers.

After patients are discharged from the CSU, every effort will be made to effectively connect or re-connect patients to outpatient providers or psychiatric facilities.

NEONATAL INTENSIVE CARE UNIT & LABOR/DELIVERY REMODEL



We have begun the remodel of these two imperative departments with construction slated to be completed late 2016.

We anticipate that this will assist us in welcoming 400-500 more babies each year. Currently Tri-City Medical Center welcomes approximately 2500 babies on an annual basis, and each is welcomed with a brief chime of the Brahm's lullaby that is heard throughout the hospital. That's 7 sweet lullabies per day!

The expansion of our level III neonatal intensive care unit will allow for the care of even more fragile newborns while staying close to mom during the first several hours when it matters most. Moms and babies will have their own separate rooms with the ability for Dad to stay overnight.

GE Healthcare Revolution[™] CT Scanner

The most advanced Computer Tomography technology from General Electric is now being used at Tri-City Medical Center enabling radiologists to make the quickest, most accurate diagnosis possible for patients. This scanner is designed for use across multiple clinical areas and has already had a dramatic impact on the delivery of care at Tri-City.

This is the first GE "Revolution" CT scanner operating in Southern California! With the new technology Tri-City is transitioning from slice counts to volumetric scanning - which means we can now take the information and make 3D images in any plane. Dr. Donald Ponec, Radiology Medical Director, San Diego Imaging, states, "This technology allows us to obtain images of any part of the body with greater efficiency, higher diagnostic quality and a considerable reduction of radiation dose."

The addition of a second advanced CT scanner in the medical center is expected to improve overall patient flow, especially in the Emergency Department.

What makes the 512 CT Scanner so great?

- .28 sub-second scanning vs. 4 second scans of 4 rotations with an older machine
- Ability to image patients that were impossible to scan before (like highly active babies)
- Instantaneous image data sets
- Enhanced Cardiac imaging capabilities (can capture SINGLE heart beats!)
- Emergent Stroke Analysis
- Enhanced Vascular Imaging Capabilities
- Cancer Staging 3D Fusion Technology
- Dramatic Radiation Reductions 30% less than former scanner
- Contrast Dose Reductions
- Impact on patient experience reduced wait times in the emergency room by over an hour

Mazor Robotics' Renaissance[™] is a speciallydesigned surgical guidance system that allows surgeons to perform safer and more accurate spine surgeries. 


