Quest	ions to Ask Yourself
•	Is the doctor's philosophy of pregnancy and birth compatible with yours? Did you feel comfortable with the doctor? And does she seem flexible enough to meet your needs? If your partner went with you to the interview, did the doctor make an effort to include both of you in the conversation? How long were you kept waiting? How helpful were the nurses and support staff at the office?
