II. QUALIFICATIONS

A. Lead Attorney Qualifications

We participate in negotiations related to insurance, indemnity, and other "legal terms" of the contract, allowing staff to focus on the scope of the performance and associated "technical terms" of the contract.

Successful public-private partnerships (P3) combine real-world business expertise with extensive knowledge about how government agencies work, from their legislative and decision-making processes and political environments to financing tools, governing laws, and public relations concerns. BB&K attorneys leverage this unique understanding when counseling public agencies and the private entities with which they partner.

Allocation and management of the risks inherent in a particular transaction, including design, construction, operation, financing and taxation impacts, as well as state and federal regulatory issues are at the heart of P3s. We have pioneered new and evolving public-private contractual arrangements for public infrastructure projects, redevelopment, military base reuse, master planned communities, and commercial and industrial projects. Proper alignment of public and private interests is critical for success; BB&K is committed to learning about and taking to heart the District's goals, aspirations, strengths, and challenges if implementing a P3 Program is what the District desires.

BB&K provides a set of tools that allow public entities, private project proponents, and investors new and expanded opportunities for successful endeavors. Whether it is the delivery of capital projects or a particular service, a concession, performance, incentive, or philanthropic agreement, BB&K has the experience and tools to help reach a workable solution.

BB&K is currently involved in several P3 efforts, including the Chula Vista Bayfront Master Plan, Hotel, and Convention Center for the San Diego Unified Port District. This hybrid infrastructure/real-estate P3 project is in the process of structuring a destination hotel and convention center, including the financing of off-site public infrastructure, public amenities, and environmental enhancements.

Environmental Law. BB&K represents special district and municipal clients in environmental issues arising under CEQA, the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), and the federal and state Endangered Species Acts (ESAs).

We are also experts at writing and editing EIRs to fully comply with CEQA's requirements.

If a legal challenge should arise, our lawyers are skilled in the procedural and substantive intricacies of litigating a CEQA or NEPA case, including the short statutes of limitations, administrative record requirements, and unique briefing and oral argument issues.

Land Use and Zoning. BB&K realizes that special districts do not have the same type of land use authority as cities and counties. We understand the unique processes that are applicable to special districts when dealing with land use projects, whether those of the District itself or projects proposed by third parties that the District has an interest in. BB&K advises clients on a wide variety of zoning, planning, and land use matters, including the development, implementation, and amendment of general and specific plans; zone changes; subdivisions; conditional use permits; variances; design review applications; development agreements; and other planning entitlements.

Real Property. BB&K lawyers routinely handle various real property matters that public agencies face, including leases, licenses/rights-of-entry, and easements both for property owned by public agency clients and for property that clients are considering acquiring. We are very experienced in the process of acquiring real property for public agency clients through both negotiated purchase and sale agreements and eminent domain lawsuits. Likewise, we are experienced in the sale or lease of a public agency client's surplus property and the potential alternatives to a sale (i.e. property exchanges).

We assist clients with acquisition of real property to be used for public agency water facilities, including wells, pipelines, pump stations, and other infrastructure. We also regularly negotiate water sale and lease agreements. In addition, BB&K attorneys work with clients and resource agency staff regarding establishing and meeting mitigation requirements under the federal Clean Water Act (CWA), the California Fish and Game Code, and other environmental protection laws to minimize the regulatory burden on client projects.

We have successfully litigated condemnation actions that involve virtually all aspects of eminent domain law, from "right to take" challenges and pre-condemnation damages claims to the trial (and possible appeal) of compensation claims for severance damages, improvements pertaining to realty, loss of business goodwill, loss of inventory, relocation assistance benefits, prejudgment possession, and inverse condemnation.

Fees and Taxes, Including Proposition 218. BB&K advises public agencies on revenue matters associated with the adoption, imposition, levy, collection, and defense of fees and taxes. We take an active role in helping clients comply with the substantive and procedural requirements of Propositions 13, 26, and 218, including the review of utility rate and fee studies and special tax reports. In this regard, we assist our clients in complying with the requirements for imposing new or increasing existing fees and charges and the election requirements for the adoption of special taxes, including the preparation of all required notices of public hearings for the adoption of fees and charges and ballot materials for the adoption and levy of special taxes. Our experience enables us to successfully facilitate the shift of decision-making power regarding revenue matters from elected officials to property owners and registered voters.

Labor and Employment Law. BB&K provides public employers with a full range of legal counsel and litigation services for all types of workplace issues and needs. A wide range of public sector employers turn to BB&K for representation in all aspects of labor and employment law. When necessary, our lawyers provide a vigorous defense in discrimination, harassment, wrongful termination, wage and hour, and other labor and employment litigation.

Because labor and employment problems often involve high stakes and intense time pressure, we are committed to giving employers highly responsive service. We counsel our clients on all aspects of employment laws and human resources management issues, including wage and hour standards, workers' compensation, layoffs, employee termination, discipline matters, and personnel policies. When workplace concerns arise out of the collective bargaining process, we handle contract negotiations; impasse procedures; grievance and arbitration proceedings; union representation proceedings; and unfair labor practice charges before local, state, and federal agencies.

Since Paula has previously provided legal services to the District, she will be able to offer historical insight to the Board. Due to her full schedule at the moment, BB&K was not able to propose her as lead counsel.

I. Regulatory Action, Tax liens, or Legal Sanctions

No regulatory action, tax lien, or legal sanction has been taken against any of the attorneys included in this proposal. The following legal action has been taken against the firm:

In 2014, five former Bell City Council members convicted of improperly taking money from the City of Bell sued BB&K alleging legal malpractice and related claims. BB&K challenged the complaint; the court agreed with BB&K's challenge; and the plaintiffs ultimately dismissed their case. No court has ever found malpractice on the part of BB&K.

I. Value-Added Services

These products are provided at a flat fee as part of a client's participation in the Public Law Update Program.

III. LEGAL APPROACH

Our fundamental role as District Counsel is to provide the Board of Directors with sound and practical legal advice. Whether drafting a contract or providing advice during Board meetings, we see our role as providing the District, its Board members, Chief Executive Officer, and administrative staff with expert analysis of the legal options available to carry out the District's policies while providing an honest and professional assessment of the legal consequences of those options. IV. FEES

BB&K recognizes the need to keep legal costs under control. We have a longstanding commitment to the affordable delivery of legal services to municipalities and public agencies. Given the depth and breadth of our experience, we often get the job done in much less time, resulting in lower overall totals.

A. Hourly Rates

General Legal Services

For general legal services, we offer the District a rate of \$320 per hour for Partners and Of Counsel and \$260 per hour for Associates. Paralegals and clerks would be billed at \$165 per hour.

Travel costs will be billed from our San Diego office at a 50 percent reduced rate for general counsel services.

Special Legal Services

For special legal services, we offer the District a rate of \$380 per hour for Partners and Of Counsel and \$285 per hour for Associates. Paralegals and clerks would be billed at \$175 per hour.

B. Estimated Monthly and Annual Cost of Services

It's our experience this general counsel work is primarily driven by the needs of the client, including the number of monthly meetings held by the Board of Directors, committees, and District staff. A typical month would entail between 30 hours to 80 hours per month, as a rough estimate, again driven by the needs of the Board of Directors and its staff. With that in mind and certain staffing assumptions, we estimate monthly costs could be between \$9,000 to \$20,000 per month and \$110,000 to \$240,000 per year. If selected, we look forward to working with the District's Board of Directors to develop a more detailed budget with additional information.

C. Reimbursements

BB&K does not charge for routine word processing, legal assistants, clerical costs, administrative support staff, secretarial costs, and office costs, including telephone and fax charges. Reimbursement of costs advanced by BB&K on behalf of the District as well as other expenses will be billed at actual cost. These currently include, but are not limited to, travel costs (mileage) at the IRS authorized rate or actual rental/fuel cost; actual expenses for being away from our offices on District business; postage; legal research; and any cost of printing or reproducing documents, photographs, or other items necessary for legal representation.

V. DISCLOSURES

Every engagement at BB&K must survive a conflicts check against the firm's conflicts database. BB&K maintains a comprehensive database on client representation. Prior to accepting any representation, the database is accessed to determine whether there are any existing conflicts. Additionally, each attorney is separately emailed a description of the proposed representation and asked to comment on any potential conflicts.

All Partners and their secretaries have coded access to the conflicts database, which includes and indexes the names of all clients, matters, opposing parties, and other parties, as well as other information, to all matters on which the firm is working or has worked. When new parties are associated with a client matter, the names of those parties are also added to the conflicts database. This database is overseen and managed by our firm's Billing and Client Information Department as well as the responsible attorney.

BB&K is currently assisting the District with its Medical Center Campus Design Build Project, providing support to the design build procurement and contracting process for the project. BB&K is working through and under contract with the District's construction manager for the project, Vanir Construction Management. Other than that project, we have determined that we do not represent any entity whose interests may constitute a conflict of interest that would prevent our continued representation of the District.
